Before you settle in, please take a moment to read through this brochure and familiarise yourself with the rules and regulations in place to ensure you keep yourselves and others safe during your stay.

Your season ticket is issued for two adults and two dependent children (under 16 years), one structure (tent, caravan or motorhome), a vehicle and ancillary equipment (gazebo, pup tent, shower tent, etc).

Further season fees apply to each additional adult and child (under 16 years).

Under 5 years free.

Your ticket must be displayed at all times during your stay – no exception!



## RULES AND REGULATIONS

### Guest Responsibilities

We ask for your cooperation so that your stay and the stay of other guests will be enjoyable.

If any of these rules are breached, you may be required to leave the campground without refund.

All persons enter the campground at their own risk and are totally responsible for their own property security, self and guests.

In the event of an emergency requiring evacuation of the camp, management will provide direction and the safest method. If you identify a hazard, please inform management as soon as possible.

### Alcohol

Alcohol is permitted on your site only.

### Behaviour

Reasonable behaviour is expected at all times – swearing, excessive drinking, and loud parties will not be tolerated.

The camp supervisor reserves the right to ask you to leave at any time without refund due to unacceptable behavior and behaviours that are impacting on others.

### Campervans/Caravans

Must provide own waste container.

Waste from chemical activated porta-potties is prohibited from being dumped in camp toilets and around the trees.

Dump stations are available at Fisherman's Bend, Waitangi and Te Akatarawa.

### Site Specifications

Maximum of 110m<sup>2</sup>.

Sufficient size to accommodate caravan or tent, one vehicle and one boat.

Keep a distance of 2.5m between each campsite for fire safety.

### Children

Parental/guardian control and supervision is expected at all times.

### Cleaning & Damage

Please notify the camp supervisor of any breakages or damage to campground property.

Please respect our facilities and keep them clean and tidy. If there are any cleaning or maintenance issues, please advise the camp supervisor.

### Cooking

Gas BBQs and gas/charcoal cookers can be used.

### Departure

Campsites, tents, caravans or other items left unoccupied without a valid season pass or pre-paid daily ticket may

be clamped, towed or packed down at Council's discretion.

### Dogs

Dogs must be under your control at all times.

While walking through the camping grounds dogs MUST be on a leash.

No dogs are permitted in the toilet facilities.

Please pick up and dispose of your dog's droppings.

Wandering dogs will be impounded if the owner cannot be located.

### Firearms

Firearms are banned from all camping sites.

### Fires

No open fires or braziers are permitted at any time.

### Freedom camping

Freedom camping along the shoreline of the Waimate Lakes is not permitted from September to May. These sites are part of the Waimate Lakes Camping Area and you are required to pay to stay.

### Parking

No parking of cars, boats or trailers outside of your site boundaries. This includes on neighbouring sites without their authority.

### Quiet Time

Quiet time is appreciated between 10pm and 7am.

Please be considerate of fellow guests at all times.

### Motorbikes

Trail bike riding is not prohibited.

### Rubbish

Please use the recycling station as advertised on the bins.

Illegal dumping of waste at campsites is prohibited – offenders will be prosecuted.

Guests are not to dump large personal items at recycling and rubbish stations, it is your responsibility to take these items to the local landfill, or with you.

### Smoking

Smoking is not permitted inside any facilities. All cigarette butts must be disposed of responsibly.

### Speed

Please watch for children and hazards and adhere to the speed limit of 10kph within all camping grounds.

### Tents

Tents must not be joined together. There must be 1.5m between any two tents.

### Vegetation

Please notify the camp supervisor immediately if tree branches require removal. Unauthorised removal of vegetation in the campgrounds is prohibited and may result in prosecution.

# RUBBISH AND RECYCLING GUIDE



## MIXED RECYCLING

You can use the yellow recycling bin for mixed recycling (except glass). Rinse all plastic, tins and aluminum containers before placing in recycling bin. Please empty any liquids, scrape off grease and any leftover food – **this is to avoid contamination of the recyclable items.**

**Caps and lids** need to be taken off and put in the red rubbish bin. Please don't put your recycling in bin liners or plastic bags. Dirty items or bottles containing liquids will be treated as waste and sent to landfill.



## GLASS RECYCLING

Glass bottles and jars need to go in the blue crate, not your yellow recycling bin.

Please place all other recycling (plastics, tins, cans, paper and cardboard) in the yellow recycling bin.

### Paper

If wet, place newspapers in red bin



### Cardboard

Boxes, egg trays. Must be flattened and dry



### Plastic containers

With numbers 1, 2 and 5 in the triangle



### Tins and cans

Place aerosol cans in red rubbish bin

### Glass

Empty and rinse bottles and place in blue glass crate



### Batteries

Take to Camp Office for recycling



### Caps and lids

Place in red rubbish bin



### Drink cartons

Place in red rubbish bin



### Polystyrene

Take clean polystyrene and styrofoam to the Waimate Resource Recovery Park for recycling.



### Soft plastics, wrappers and bags

Place in red rubbish bin

### Disposable nappies and sanitary items

Place in red rubbish bin



### Electrical items

Take items to the Waimate Resource Recovery Park for recycling



### Clothes, toys, shoes

Take items in good condition to reuse shop



### Pots and pans

Take items in good condition to reuse shop

### Glass bottles

Rinsed with lids and caps off. Place lids and caps in red rubbish bin



### Glass jars

Rinsed with lids and caps off. Place lids and caps in red rubbish bin

### Broken glass

Wrap broken items securely in paper or plastic packaging to protect our rubbish collectors and place in red rubbish bin. Place lids and caps in red rubbish bin



### Light bulbs

Wrap broken items securely in paper or plastic packaging to protect our rubbish collectors and place in red rubbish bin



### Broken tableware

Wrap broken items securely in paper or plastic packaging to protect our rubbish collectors and place in red rubbish bin





# RUBBISH

The red rubbish bin has all contents sent to landfill and should be the last resort for any household material.

## General household waste

Crockery, old clothes, crayons, takeaway cups, toothpaste tubes, cold extinguished cigarette butts and disposable cutlery



## Lids and caps

Lids from bottles and containers



## Disposal nappies and sanitary items



## Food wrappers

Fast food wrappers, bags, boxes with plastic or wax coating



## Polystyrene and styrofoam

Take clean polystyrene and styrofoam to the Waimate Resource Recovery Park for recycling.



Place dirty polystyrene and styrofoam in red rubbish bin

## Soft plastic, wrappers and bags

## Broken glass

Wrap in paper or plastic packaging and place in bin
